



# Irish Concrete Society 43rd Annual Awards Nomination Form



**An award for excellence in design or  
construction in concrete**

The Irish Concrete Society's Award Scheme acknowledges construction achievements in which concrete, in any form, contributes significantly to the built environment. Entries relating to any aspect of building, civil engineering, architecture, art or landscaping will be accepted by the Society.

Entries are divided into three categories:

- **Building**
- **Infrastructure**
- **Element** (housing or small projects such as walls, stairs or paving)

Adjudication will be carried out by an independent jury appointed by the Council of the Society. A winner is chosen from each of the three categories, with one overall winner then selected from these. Depending on the level and quality of entries, at their discretion the jury may award a high commendation to any project, or projects, deemed to be of sufficient quality. Special recognition for the use of concrete in a sustainable context may also be awarded.

Nominations for the Award may be made by Clients, Architects, Consulting Engineers, Material Suppliers, Contractors or others directly involved with the project. Nominations must refer to **completed work, located in Ireland, which commenced no earlier than January 2021, and completed by the end of 2025.**

Projects nominated for previous years' awards may remain eligible for this year's competition if they meet the commencement date requirements. A new nomination form and photographs will be required.

Entries must:

1. Be made on the nomination form.
2. Include a **300-word minimum** description of the project and reason for the nomination. Where appropriate, entries should include a brief description of the sustainability aspects of the use of concrete in the project.
3. Include at least **six (6) high quality images** (JPEG format preferred) of the project, under construction and when completed. Images should be a minimum 150dpi with a 1.5MB file size or greater.

These images will be used to help the jury form initial impressions on the merits of the entry and for public display on the Awards Evening. The Society retains use of all images for later promotional purposes.

Note: Any entry submitted without the required description and images may not be accepted by the jury. All jury decisions are final; no discussion or correspondence will be entered into relating to any jury decisions.
